SUBJECT: General Services - Authorize sale of surplus/obsolete vehicles to Torrance Unified School District. Expenditure: Not applicable.

RECOMMENDATION

The General Services Director recommends that the City Council authorize the sale of five (5) surplus/obsolete vehicles to the Torrance Unified School District (TUSD) for a total of \$4,939.00

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In accordance with the provisions of Section 21.2.3.g of the Torrance Municipal Code, the City Council may authorize the sale of obsolete personal property to a public agency or to a charitable, civic or non-profit organization.

Section 21.2.3 of the Torrance Municipal Code; METHODS OF DISPOSITION OF OBSOLETE PERSONAL PROPERTY states...

The City Council may authorize the sale, lease or donation of Obsolete Personal Property to the federal government or one of its agencies; to the State of California; to any county, city, school district, special district; other governmental agency; or to any charitable, civic or non-profit organization. The price and terms of transfer must be established by the City Council, but may be made without advertisement for or receipt of bids."


