Members of the Council:

SUBJECT: Fire Department – Approve placement of a Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker at Fire Station 4 and agreement with Riviera Garden Club and its contractor for installation and maintenance of the marker. Expenditure: None.

RECOMMENDATION

The Fire Chief recommends that the City Council:

- 1) Approve the placement of a Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker – a tribute to the nation’s armed forces – at Fire Station 4 next to the wall along Pacific Coast Highway (PCH); and
- 2) Approve the License Agreement with Riviera Garden Club and its contractor, Bulldog Plumbing, Heating, and General Contracting, allowing them to enter the Fire Station 4 property located at 5205 Calle Mayor, Torrance, for the purpose to install and maintain the marker.

Funding

None required. The entire cost for the installation and maintenance of the marker as well as for any attendant landscaping will be covered by the Riviera Garden Club.

BACKGROUND

On June 12, 2007, Torrance City Council approved a Blue Star recognition program to honor the Torrance residents and families of those who are serving in the Armed Forces. At that time it was noted (in the supplemental to the agenda item) that in addition to the military recognition program, there is a Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker program and staff would be bringing information on this activity for Council consideration in the next several weeks.

The Blue Star Memorial Highway Program started as a nationwide movement after World War II to pay tribute to the nation’s armed forces by designating various State and national routes as “Blue Star Memorial Highways.” In 1945, the National Council of State Garden Clubs, Inc. approved the Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker

program. California Garden Clubs, Inc. accepted the program in 1947. The Blue Star name comes from the blue star in the service flag. The blue star was chosen to symbolize the memorial because it was used during World War II on flags and homes of families that had a son or daughter in the armed forces.

In January 2007, Mr. George Unrine contacted Fire Station 4 and conveyed that the Riviera Garden Club was considering Fire Station 4 and the grounds near the Torrance Welcome Marker on PCH at the Redondo Beach boundary as possible locations for the marker their Club would like to sponsor. He asked California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) to review the sites for feasibility. According to Mr. Unrine, the Caltrans representative stated that the Fire Station would be an appropriate location and expressed no safety concerns. However, the Caltrans representative also determined that both locations were outside of Caltrans right-of-way. So, while they can allow the marker to sit outside their property, the maintenance of the marker would not be their responsibility.

ANALYSIS

After visiting the sites and considering the pros and cons of each location, the Riviera Garden Club along with the representative from City's Public Works and the Caltrans representative have decided to request permission to place the marker at Fire Station #4 next to the wall along PCH. The cement that covers what used to be part of the planter along the wall facing PCH would be removed. The sidewalk would remain intact. The sprinkler system would be extended into the new garden area to feed a drip system. Plantings would extend the themes in the existing garden. A dedication ceremony would be held after the marker is installed.

The proposed text on the marker is as follows:

BLUE STAR MEMORIAL HIGHWAY

A tribute to the Armed Forces
that have defended the
United States of America
SPONSORED BY
Riviera Garden Club - founded 1957
IN COOPERATION WITH
California Garden Clubs, Inc.
AND
The City of Torrance

The Riviera Garden Club is sponsoring the marker and will cover all expenses for the installation, landscaping, and maintaining the marker and the area around it with their funds. They ask for permission to install the marker on city property. The Riviera Garden Club will use a licensed and bonded contractor for the hardscape changes but will add the plants themselves and will be responsible for maintaining the marker and any attendant landscaping.

Attached for your approval is a License Agreement with Riviera Garden Club and with Bulldog Plumbing, Heating, and General Contracting, which allows them to enter upon the property of Fire Station 4 located at 5205 Calle Mayor, Torrance for the purpose of installing and maintaining the Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker. The license will be effective from June 1, 2007 until revoked by City upon thirty days' notice, or until Licensee gives notice of its intent to terminate. The Riviera Garden Club must have misunderstood what was communicated to them and had the contractor remove the concrete and put the post before the matter was brought to staff to prepare an agenda item. This explains the retroactive effective date on the agreement. Attachment 1 to the agreement is a picture representation of the proposed location and how the marker would look along the wall of PCH.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement (“License”) is made and entered into as of June 1, 2007, by and between the CITY OF TORRANCE, a Municipal Corporation (“CITY”), Riviera Garden Club, an unincorporated association (“LICENSEE”) and Bulldog Plumbing, Heating and General Contracting (“CONTRACTOR”).

RECITALS:

- A. CITY is the owner of fee title to a property commonly known as Fire Station 4, located at 5205 Calle Mayor, Torrance, Los Angeles County, California.
- B. LICENSEE wishes to install one Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker, on the perimeter of Fire Station 4 adjacent to Pacific Coast Highway.
- C. LICENSEE’s agent Bulldog Plumbing, Heating and General Contracting (“CONTRACTOR”) will install the marker.

AGREEMENT:

Therefore, in order to carry out their intent as expressed above, CITY, LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

1. PROPERTY
CITY grants LICENSEE a license to occupy and use, subject to all terms and conditions stated, a portion of the land commonly identified as 5205 Calle Mayor, Torrance, Los Angeles County, California (the “property”).
2. PURPOSE
LICENSEE and its agents may enter upon the property for the purpose of installing and maintaining one Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker. The anticipated location for the marker is on the Pacific Coast Highway side of Fire Station 4. A photograph of the proposed location is attached to this License as Attachment 1. Prior to any entry upon the property, LICENSEE must clear the activities it intends to undertake upon the property and the location of those activities with the Fire Chief’s Office.
3. TERM
This LICENSE will be effective until revoked by CITY upon thirty days’ notice, or until LICENSEE gives notice of its intent to terminate.
4. INSTALLATION OF MARKER.
Bulldog Plumbing, Heating and General Contracting (“CONTRACTOR”) will install the marker. Bulldog has a Torrance business license. Bulldog’s proprietor

is Doug Arneson, telephone (310) 378-9054; fax (310) 378-3079. LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR will receive precise location approval from the Fire Chief's Office, will obtain all necessary permits (no fee) from CITY's Division of Building and Safety, and will receive clearance from Underground Alert prior to undertaking any installation activities on the property. LICENSEE is responsible for the cost of all labor and materials involved in providing and installing the marker and any attendant landscaping. Landscaping must be approved in concept by the Fire Chief's Office prior to planting. Neither LICENSEE nor CONTRACTOR may interfere with the operations of Fire Station 4 at any time during the installation of the marker or during any subsequent maintenance of the marker or landscaping. During installation of the marker, LICENSEE agrees to maintain the site in a neat and sanitary condition. Upon completion of installation, LICENSEE will insure that the property is clean of all debris, surplus construction materials, and any hazardous materials. Failure by LICENSEE to perform the work will result in the CITY implementing the cleanup. Any expenses incurred will be billed to LICENSEE.

5. MAINTENANCE OF MARKER AND LANDSCAPING

LICENSEE is responsible for maintaining the marker and any attendant landscaping. If the marker is accidentally damaged or vandalized, LICENSEE is responsible for its restoration, replacement or removal. LICENSEE is required to notify the Fire Department's Administrative Chief's Office before any maintenance work is to be done on the property.

LICENSEE, CONTRACTOR and CITY will promptly notify each other in writing of any change in their respective notice addresses.

7. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSEE

- A. LICENSEE must maintain at its sole expense the following insurance, which will be full coverage not subject to self insurance provisions:
 - 1. General Liability including coverage for non-owned and hired vehicles, property, products and completed operations, independent contractors/vendors, personal injury and contractual obligations with combined single limits of coverage of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- B. The insurance provided by LICENSEE will be primary and non-contributory
- C. CITY, the City Council and each member thereof, members of boards and commissions, every officer, agent, official, employee and volunteer must be named as additional insured under the automobile and general liability policies.
- D. LICENSEE must provide certificates of insurance and/or endorsements to the City Clerk of the City of Torrance before the commencement of work.
- E. Insurance or bonds required by this Agreement will be satisfactory only if issued by companies admitted to do business in California, rated "B+" or better in the most recent edition of Best's Key Rating Guide, and only if they are of a financial category Class VII or better, unless these requirements are waived by the Risk Manager of CITY ("Risk Manager") due to unique circumstances. In the event the Risk Manager determines that the work or services to be performed under this Agreement creates an increased or decreased risk of loss to CITY, LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR agree that nature of coverage, or the minimum limits of any insurance policies or performance bonds required by this Agreement may be changed accordingly upon receipt of written notice from the Risk Manager; provided that LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR will have the right to appeal a determination of increased coverage by the Risk Manager to the City Council of CITY within 10 days of receipt of notice from the Risk Manager.

8. INDEMNIFICATION

CONTRACTOR will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless CITY, the City Council, each member thereof, present and future, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, expenses, including defense

costs and legal fees, and claims for damages whatsoever, including, but not limited to, those arising from breach of contract, bodily injury, death, personal injury, property damage, loss of use, or property loss however the same may be caused and regardless of the responsibility for negligence, arising from the negligent acts or omissions, or willful misconduct of CONTRACTOR, its officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or vendors. It is further agreed, CONTRACTOR's obligations to indemnify, defend and hold harmless will be proportionate in the event of concurrent negligence on the part of CITY, the City Council, each member thereof, present and future, or its officers, agents and employees, except for liability resulting solely from the negligence or willful misconduct of CITY, its officers, employees or agents. In the event of any dispute between CONTRACTOR and CITY, as to whether liability arises from the negligence of the CITY or its officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or vendors, CONTRACTOR will be obligated to pay for CITY's defense until such time as a final judgment has been entered adjudicating the CITY's negligence. CONTRACTOR will be entitled in the event of such a determination to reimbursement of defense costs including but not limited to attorney's fees, expert fees and costs of litigation, in proportion to the CITY's liability.

9. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTOR

- A. CONTRACTOR must maintain at its sole expense the following insurance, which will be full coverage not subject to self insurance provisions:
 - 1. General Liability including coverage for property, products and completed operations, independent contractors/vendors, personal injury and contractual obligations with combined single limits of coverage of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- B. The insurance provided by CONTRACTOR will be primary and non-contributory.
- C. CITY, the City Council and each member thereof, members of boards and commissions, every officer, agent, official, employee and volunteer must be named as additional insured under the automobile and general liability policies.
- D. CONTRACTOR must provide certificates of insurance and/or endorsements to the City Clerk of the City of Torrance before the commencement of work.
- E. Each insurance policy required by this Paragraph must contain a provision that no termination, cancellation or change of coverage can be made without thirty days notice to CITY.

F. Insurance or bonds required by this Agreement will be satisfactory only if issued by companies admitted to do business in California, rated “B+” or better in the most recent edition of Best’s Key Rating Guide, and only if they are of a financial category Class VII or better, unless these requirements are waived by the Risk Manager of CITY (“Risk Manager”) due to unique circumstances. In the event the Risk Manager determines that the work or services to be performed under this Agreement creates an increased or decreased risk of loss to CITY, LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR agree that nature of coverage, or the minimum limits of any insurance policies or performance bonds required by this Agreement may be changed accordingly upon receipt of written notice from the Risk Manager; provided that LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR will have the right to appeal a determination of increased coverage by the Risk Manager to the City Council of CITY within 10 days of receipt of notice from the Risk Manager.

10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES & REGULATIONS

LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR agree to comply with all applicable Federal, State, County and City statutes, ordinances, rules, laws or regulations that are applicable to the property or the operations of LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR on the property, and any deviation from these or any conditions stated in this LICENSE will be cause of immediate cancellation.

11. INTEGRATION; AMENDMENT

This License represents the entire understanding of CITY, LICENSEE and CONTRACTOR as to those matters contained in it. No prior oral or written understanding will be of any force or effect with respect to the terms of this License. The License may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both parties.

12. INTERPRETATION

The terms of this License should be construed in accordance with the meaning of the language used and should not be construed for or against either party by reason of the authorship of this License or any other rule of construction that might otherwise apply.

13. SEVERABILITY

If any part of this License is found to be in conflict with applicable laws, that part will be inoperative, null and void insofar as it is in conflict with any applicable laws, but the remainder of the License will remain in full force and effect.

14. GOVERNING LAW; JURISDICTION

This License will be administered and interpreted under the laws of the State of California. Jurisdiction of any litigation arising from the License will be in Los Angeles County, California.

15. WAIVER OF BREACH

No delay or omission in the exercise of any right or remedy by a nondefaulting party on any default will impair the right or remedy or be construed as a waiver. A party's consent or approval of any act by the other party requiring the party's consent or approval will not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary the other party's consent to or approval of any subsequent act. Any waiver by either party of any default must be in writing and will not be a waiver of any other default concerning the same or any other provision of this License.

16. ATTORNEY'S FEES

In any dispute, litigation, arbitration, or other proceeding by which one party either seeks to enforce its rights under this License (whether in contract, tort or both) or seeks a declaration of any rights or obligations under this License, the prevailing party will be awarded reasonable attorney's fees, together with any costs and expenses, to resolve the dispute and to enforce any judgment.

17. LICENSEE'S AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE

The person(s) executing this License on behalf of the LICENSEE warrant that (i) the LICENSEE is duly organized and existing; (ii) they are duly authorized to execute this License on behalf of the LICENSEE; (iii) by so executing this License, the LICENSEE is formally bound to the provisions of this License; and (iv) the entering into this License does not violate any provision of any other License to which the LICENSEE is bound.

18. CONTRACTOR'S AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE

The person(s) executing this License on behalf of the CONTRACTOR warrant that (i) the CONTRACTOR is duly organized and existing; (ii) they are duly authorized to execute this License on behalf of the CONTRACTOR; (iii) by so executing this License, the CONTRACTOR is formally bound to the provisions of this License; and (iv) the entering into this License does not violate any provision of any other License to which the CONTRACTOR is bound.



BLUE STAR MEMORIAL HIGHWAYS AND BYWAYS

Ruth Angevine

NGC adopted the Blue Star Memorial Highways project in 1946. There are three Memorial Markers, and all are a tribute to the men and women in the armed forces who have served, are presently serving and will serve in the future. The large Blue Star Highway Memorial Markers are placed only on dedicated highways. A second large Memorial Marker, minus the word "highway," was approved in 1996 for dedication at National Cemeteries or V.A. Medical Facilities. The Blue Star Memorial By-Way Marker, approved in 1994, is to be placed in parks, historic sites and civic areas. It bears the words, A Tribute to the Armed Forces of America. In 2004 the addition of state veterans homes and selected cemeteries where veterans are buried was approved for memorial markers. Markers may not bear an individual's name. Dedications are eligible for CGCI B-2 award. State winner forwarded to Regional # 6. (NGC Award certificates for # 29.) Clubs and districts are urged to contribute by budgeting funds for the Blue Star Memorial Fund that has been established to assist clubs or districts needing financial assistance to purchase and/or refurbish Memorial Markers.
