Members of the City Council:

SUBJECT: City Manager – Review and give direction regarding the request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation for funding towards the installation of banners. Expenditure: \$2,240.

RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation of the City Manager that City Council consider a request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation for the City to fund and approve the installation of:

- Twenty-four (24) banners along Torrance Boulevard between Madrona Avenue and Hawthorne Boulevard from September 15, 2008 through November 21, 2008; and
- Sixteen (16) banners in the Cultural Arts Center parking lot from November 21, 2008 through February 23, 2009.

Funding

If the proposal is approved, an appropriation of \$2,240 is required from the Program Contingency Reserve. The Contingency Reserve balance is \$182,321.

BACKGROUND

The City Manager received a request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation Executive Director, Ray Solley, on August 25, 2008 (Attachment A) requesting that the City hang banners for upcoming events at the Cultural Arts Center. A similar request was made and sent to Your Honorable Body for review last year (Attachment B). At that time the City Council approved the expenditure, however, there was some concern about making this an annual funding request.

The Council transmittal from the previous request discussed that the City of Torrance has no procedures or policy for hanging banners on streetlights within the City limits. Banners have been limited in the past to City events such as Armed Forces Day and holiday banners within the Hawthorne Boulevard corridor.

Discussed in last year's transmittal was that if the City Council wishes to approve the request, a policy be developed that would assist staff in reviewing these types of requests in the future. The City Council may wish to establish the following criteria:

Banners may be considered if the proponent meets the following criteria:

- The proponent is a non-profit; and
- The event is held within the City of Torrance; and
- The event is sponsored or cosponsored by the City of Torrance; and
- Banner requests must meet temporary sign criteria and not be installed for a period greater than 90 days.

At this time no criteria has been established and there is no funding allotment for this request, therefore the request has been submitted for City Council review.


ANALYSIS

The Foundation receives a direct cash subsidy from the City of Torrance of \$103,040 and an indirect subsidy of \$43,600 which is used to offset costs associated with the use of the Armstrong Theater. The request before you is in addition to the already authorized financial subsidy for the Foundation.

Staff has been informed that other than funding, the Foundation needs the City to contract for the banner installation due to liability issues with Southern California Edison and the use of their poles. If Your Honorable Body does not wish to fund this request the Foundation would need to provide funds to the City in order for a contract to be implemented.



Dear Mayor Scotto:

As you know, the mission of the Torrance Cultural Arts Center Foundation is to help raise the visibility of the Arts Center as an area-wide destination for high quality entertainment.

In the Fall of 2007, we succeeded in raising that visibility – and significantly improving ticket sales – by hanging banners promoting the season's top acts along Torrance Boulevard near the Civic Center.

Given the large amount of commuters and “daytime citizens” in Torrance, we again need the City's permission to install street banners on lamp poles. Due to construction zones, the optimum location is initially on twenty-four light poles along Torrance Blvd. between Madrona and Hawthorne, and then, in late November, on eight light poles owned by the City in the Arts Center parking lot. **All banners would be the same size as last year and meet Southern California Edison requirements.** They would feature color pictures of the most recognizable artists the Foundation is bringing to the Armstrong Theatre in 2008-09. (Images of sample banners are attached).

As we did last year, the Foundation will pay for the design and production of the banners. To comply with insurance rules, we request the City of Torrance again pay for installation. The installation and removal costs total \$2,240.

The optimum timeline is:

Sept. 9, 2008	Council approval
Sept. 15, 2008	Installation of 24 banners on Torrance Blvd.
Nov. 21, 2008	Removal of banners on Torrance Blvd.
Nov. 21, 2008	Installation of 16 banners in the Arts Center parking lot
Feb. 23, 2009	Removal of banners from Center parking lot

Thank you for your support of this special project to benefit the Torrance Cultural Arts Center.

SUBJECT: City Manager – Review and give direction regarding the request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation for funding towards the installation of banners

RECOMMENDATION

The City Manager recommends that City Council consider a request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation for the City to fund and approve the installation of 24 banners along Torrance Boulevard between Maple Avenue and Hickory Avenue from September 9, 2007 through November 9, 2007. Estimated expenditure \$2,694.

Funding:

If the proposal is approved, an appropriation of \$2,694 is required from the Program Contingency Reserve.

BACKGROUND

The City Manager received a request from the Cultural Arts Center Foundation Executive Director, Ray Solley, on July 27, 2007 (Attachment B) requesting that the City hang banners for upcoming events at the Center. Mr. Solley was contacted and it was explained that the City does not have the ability to hang street light banners and that an outside firm would have to be utilized. It was also stated that these types of banners would have to be approved by the City Council as there is no mechanism to approve them at the staff level.

A subsequent request was submitted via e-mail (Attachment A) requesting permission to hang the banners, as well as for the City to fund the installation cost of \$2,694.00.

ANALYSIS

The City of Torrance has no procedures or policy for hanging banners on streetlights within the City limits. Banners have been limited in the past to City events such as Armed Forces Day and holiday banners within the Hawthorne Boulevard corridor.

If the City Council wishes to approve the request before you this evening, a policy for reviewing these requests would assist staff in reviewing these types of requests in the future. The City Council may wish to establish the following criteria:

Banners may be considered if the proponent meets the following criteria:


- The proponent is a non-profit; and

Brian:

Thank you for further considering the request from the Torrance Cultural Arts Center Foundation for permission to place banners featuring our 2007-08 season along Torrance Blvd. this Fall. Jasun Botiller has a copy of my original request to the City Manager dated July 27, 2007.

Permission to Hang Banners

We currently anticipate creating 24 banners. They would be posted on light poles, 12 on each side of Torrance Blvd. between Madrona and Hickory. Each banner is a standard three feet wide and six feet high. They would be anchored at both top and bottom.

Pictures of some of the most prominent artists the Foundation is bringing to the Armstrong would be featured on both sides of each banner. Attached are two samples of artwork we're considering using.

In order to maximize exposure during the start of our season, the banners would be up from September 4- November 9, 2007.

Request for Cost of Installation

We have received competitive bids from three companies to handle both printing and installation.

The Foundation will pay for the design and production of all banners. We would like the City to either pay the installer directly or reimburse the Foundation for the direct costs of installation.

Sign-A-Rama (4340 Redondo Beach Blvd., Torrance) would be the printer and installer. The intallation costs would be:

One of the goals of the Torrance Cultural Arts Center Foundation for our 2007-08 season is to help raise the visibility of the Center as an area-wide destination for cultural entertainment. Our ongoing print and direct mail efforts will partially achieve that goal.

But, given the large amount of commuters and "daytime citizens" in Torrance, we would like permission to install banners from September 4- November 9, 2007 on selected street lamp poles on Torrance Blvd. between Madrona and Hickory. These banners would be the same size as the ones hung last May promoting the Armed Forces Parade, and would feature color pictures of some of the most recognizable artists the Foundation is bringing to the Armstrong Theatre in 2007-08.

The Foundation will pay for the design and production of these banners. Could the city handle the installation process? If so, that would result in savings of about \$2,500 for the Foundation.

Once this is approved, I will coordinate logistics, production and selection of a vendor with Jasun Botiller in General Services. In order to meet our early-September deadline, I need to hear back from you by August 6th.

Thank you for your consideration and support of this special project to benefit the Torrance Cultural Arts Center.

**SUBJECT: TORRANCE CULTURAL ARTS CENTER FOUNDATION (TCACF)
 INCREASED SUBSIDY FUNDING BUDGET REQUEST**

RECOMMENDATION

The City Manager recommends that the one-time additional assistance provided to TCACF in the amount of \$23,040 this fiscal year become an on-going subsidy, increasing the total direct subsidy to TCACF to \$103,040; and continue the indirect subsidy of approximately \$43,600 for rental of the Armstrong Theatre at no cost to TCACF. The combined direct and indirect subsidies are equal to \$146,640 to assist in funding TCACF's program goals. Theatre Labor of \$36,240 and Printing of \$25,000 would be on an in-kind basis combined with a cash payment of \$41,800 for a total of \$103,040.

This recommendation is based partially on the need to increase the City's funding of the Cultural Arts Center by the General Fund in the amount of \$285,000 to assist in covering the cost of subsidies for non-profit organizations and increased labor and operating costs. This is discussed further in the Program Modification Section of the Proposed FY 2007-09 Operating Budget.

The City Manager further proposes that the City fund a one-time expenditure in an amount of between \$25,000 to \$35,000 to employ a consultant skilled in developing business plans for arts foundations to work with the City and TCACF to develop a business plan for TCACF. This would provide a review of the current business model and establish guidelines and policies to allow TCACF to work towards achieving its funding goals, and an assessment of support and program expenses reasonable for obtaining the goals. If approved, the City Manager will return with an item in the near future.

ANALYSIS

Attached is a letter from TCACF requesting additional funding for fiscal year 2007-08 (Attachment A). The budget request is summarized below noting current funding by category and the additional assistance being requested.

In meeting with representatives of TCACF, they have stated a need to continue with the additional funding of \$23,040 approved by Council on a one-time basis at the FY 2006-07 1st Quarter Budget Hearing. To this TCACF foresees an expanding need to increase the direct subsidy in FY 2007-08 by an additional \$77,560 for a total direct subsidy by the City of \$180,600. Increasing the subsidy may increase number of programs offered, assist with inflation based cost increases, help underwrite the Programmer/Executive Director's salary and provide for rental of office and storage space for TCACF.

Attendance Overview

City staff reviewed attendance and operating results with TCACF. A 5-year 'snapshot' of the operating budget compared to ticket sales was provided and is attached as Attachment B. It reflects that the operating budget has increased from \$40,000 for the 1995-96 Season, with ticket sales of \$39,600 for 22 performances and attendance of 6,200 (including the children's series), to an operating budget of \$738,000 for the 2005-06 Season with ticket sales of \$193,000 for 27 performances and attendance of 8,765 (including the children's series).

Specific detail is not available to analyze attendance by performance for earlier years; however, for the 2006-07 Season, through March 25, 2007, City Staff has provided attendance detail in Attachment C based on box office records summarized as follows:

Nakano Theatre (Jazz Cabaret/150 seat capacity)	89% average attendance
Armstrong Theatre (Invited Audience/502 seat capacity)	95% average attendance
Armstrong Theatre (General Audience/502 seat capacity)	56% average attendance

TCACF has provided a profit and loss analysis by program for programs offered September 2006 through March 2007 with attendance at each performance noted. This analysis is attached as Attachment D.

Operations Summary

Operationally, the following summarizes the primary components for TCACF for the past 5 fiscal years 2001 – 2005, in thousands (detail in Attachment E).



Comments:

- For FY 2001-02, the City approved a direct subsidy of \$45K, or 11.2% of operating resources plus indirect subsidy through absorbing cost of rental of the Armstrong Theatre for TCACF rehearsals and performances.
- For FY 2002-03 through 2005-06, the City approved a direct subsidy of \$80K a year, or 17.9%, 13.2%, 12.1% and 14.2%, respectively, of operating resources, plus indirect subsidy through absorbing cost of rental of the Armstrong Theatre for TCACF rehearsals and performances. The cost absorbed in FY 2005-06 was \$43,600 raising the City's combined subsidy value to 21.9% of operating resources for last fiscal year.
- For FY 2001-02 through FY 2005-06, TCACF expenses include sponsorships of other community art organizations. The amounts for each year, respectively, were \$11,300, \$12,700, \$11,900, \$44,700, and \$64,800. The organizations assisted in fiscal year 2005-2006 include:

⇒ Torrance Arts Museum	\$25,000
⇒ Torrance Theatre Company	\$25,000
⇒ Bramhall School Outreach	\$12,000
⇒ Other	\$ 2,800
- For FY 2005-06, the increased operating loss resulted primarily from a reduction of restricted donations to fund programs, and an increase in program expenses.
