The Torrance Municipal Code, Section 21.2.3 METHODS OF DISPOSITION OF OBSOLETE PERSONAL PROPERTY” states...

The City Council may authorize the sale, lease or donation of Obsolete Personal Property to the federal government or one of its agencies; to the State of California; to any county, city, school district, special district; other governmental agency; or to any charitable, civic or non-profit organization. The price and terms of transfer must be established by the City Council, but may be made without advertisement for or receipt of bids.”




