



Title of Proposal: Extension of Interim Urgency Ordinance

Applicant: City Initiated

Proposal Description: A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE EXTENSION OF AN INTERIM ORDINANCE ADOPTED AS AN URGENCY MEASURE ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON MASSAGE OR ACUPRESSURE ESTABLISHMENTS AND MASSAGE OR ACUPRESSURE TECHNICIANS FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED TEN MONTHS AND FIFTEEN DAYS. THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM WAS ORIGINALLY ADOPTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL ON APRIL 28, 2009, AS ORDINANCE NO. 3718.

Environmental Considerations: Pursuant to California Public Resources Code section 21065 and California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.

All interested persons have the right and are invited to attend this meeting and express their opinion. You may provide verbal or written testimony at the public hearing. You may also submit written testimony in advance of the public hearing if you are unable to attend.

Please be advised that the extension only applies to new Massage/Acupressure Establishments. We will start accepting applications for new Massage/Acupressure Technicians as of June 15, 2009, which is the first business day after the original 45 day moratorium.
